Report of the 9th Hong Kong Games Organising Committee

Purpose

This paper aims to report to Members the formation of the 9th Hong Kong Games (HKG) Organising Committee (OC) and the progress of its work.

Background

- 2. To further promote the "Sport for All" culture in the community, the Sports Commission (SC) has organised the HKG biennially since 2007. HKG is a territory-wide major multi-sport event with the 18 District Councils (DCs) as participating units. Its objectives are to provide districts with more opportunities for sports participation, exchanges and co-operation, and to encourage active public participation in sports. Apart from improving sporting standards at the district level, the HKG can also strengthen the public's sense of belonging to the district they live in and help promote social cohesion through facilitating communication and fostering friendship among the 18 districts. Organised by the SC and coordinated by the Community Sports Committee (CSC) of the SC, the HKG has been co-organised by the 18 DCs, the Leisure and Cultural Services Department (LCSD), the Sports Federation and Olympic Committee of Hong Kong, China (SF&OC), and the relevant national sports associations of the competitive events.
- 3. The 9th HKG is due to take place between 2023 and 2024. Given that the current term of office of the DCs will end on 31 December 2023 and that the details of the proposals on improving governance at district level are yet to be confirmed before establishment of the OC, it is decided that the Home Affairs Department, instead of the DCs, will act as one of the co-organisers of the 9th HKG.

Organising Committee/Standing Committee

4. Following formation of the 9th HKGOC in June 2023 to facilitate the preparatory work of the HKG, the establishment of a Standing Committee (SC) under

the OC was endorsed at its first meeting on 7 June. The structure of the 9th HKG, as well as the membership of the OC and SC are at Annex I. Later, meetings were held by the SC on 21 July and 13 October to assist in the co-ordination, organisation and execution of the specific arrangements of the various work related to the HKG. These include devising the programmes of the 9th HKG, and holding district athlete selections, pre-event training of district delegations, inter-district competitions of the 18 districts, as well as a series of community participation programmes. The progress of such work is set out in ensuing paragraphs.

Work Progress

Positioning and Objectives

5. The positioning for the 9th HKG will remain unchanged, which means further promoting the "Sports for All" culture in the community; encouraging more active public participation in sports; promoting the public awareness on and the atmosphere of sports participation across the territory; as well as facilitating communication and sports exchanges among the 18 districts and strengthening the public's sense of belonging to the district they live in through inter-district competitions.

Competition Events, Dates and Venues of the Events

6. Having taken into account of the factors such as popularity of the sports in Hong Kong, and availability of existing facilities and human resources, the OC has decided on the eight sports events for the 9th HKG, namely athletics, badminton, futsal, swimming, table tennis, tennis, volleyball, and 3-on-3 basketball, which is hugely popular among young people and to be held instead of traditional basketball. In addition, individual events in athletics, swimming, badminton, table-tennis and tennis will be divided into three age groups, namely "15 or below", "16 to 17" and "18 or above", to encourage more members of the public, especially young people, to participate in the HKG. There will be no age-specific divisions in team events. To select eligible athletes for the inter-district competitions, district athlete selections will be held from July 2023 to January 2024 across the 18 districts. The actual inter-district competitions will be held from 21 April to 2 June 2024, with some of the events commencing in March 2024. The finals of each event will take place from 11 May to 2 June at the venues under the LCSD.

Competition Rules and Regulations

7. To encourage greater participation from young people in the inter-district

competitions, the 9th HKG will adopt those competition rules and regulations, which are broadly in line with the 8th HKG. Major highlights and modifications are as follows:

(a) Athlete Eligibility

At the first meeting of the OC, members voted to pass a resolution that further relaxes the entry restrictions to those elite athletes participating in the HKG. Except for athletes who have won medals in international major sporting events, e.g. the Olympic Games and the Asian Games, held two years before the current HKG, all other active or retired elite athletes who are eligible may enrol for the district athlete selections of the HKG.

(b) Quotas for Athletes

For the three age groups under the individual events of athletics, swimming, badminton, table tennis and tennis, each district can nominate two representatives to participate in each of such events in the inter-district competitions. The maximum number of nominees from each district will increase from 236 in the previous HKG to 524. In addition, for team events such as futsal and volleyball, the number of representing teams nominated by each district will increase from the previous one team per event to two. As for the newly introduced 3-on-3 basketball, each district can nominate up to three teams. The maximum number of nominees from each district to participate in inter-district team events will increase from 88 in the previous HKG to 156.

Furthermore, team events for individual sports such as badminton, table tennis and tennis will be cancelled in the 9th HKG, in a bid to strike a balance between the use of additional venues required for the new age groups events and the public's keen demand for sports facilities.

(c) Competition Format and Rules

As regards grouping in inter-district competitions, except for the newly introduced 3-on-3 basketball, the seeding system will, as in the past, be adopted in the remaining sports competitions, with the aim of enhancing their competitiveness and attractiveness. The single round robin format will be adopted in the preliminaries of 3-on-3 basketball, volleyball and futsal, where group winners will compete in the knockout stage for their final rankings.

(d) <u>Teams Selection and Enrolment</u>

- i) To encourage more youth players to participate in team events such as futsal and volleyball, a maximum of 20 are allowed on a team's roster. Those teams with 10 or fewer players must have at least two youth players aged 21 or below; while the other teams must have at least three youth players aged 21 or below. As regards 3-on-3 basketball, a team's roster can include up to six players. Those teams with six players must have at least two youth players aged 18 or below; while the other teams with five or fewer players must have at least one youth player aged 18 or below. To offer greater flexibility in player deployment during a match, there will be no restrictions on the number of youth players on the field/court.
- ii) If the champion and runner-up teams of the district selection in futsal and volleyball have fewer players than the maximum number allowed, districts may, in light of the circumstances, select players from the third- and fourth-placed teams as appropriate to fill the vacancies in the above teams. As regards 3-on-3 basketball, districts may select players from the fourth-placed team as appropriate to fill the vacancies in the champion, runner-up and third-placed teams. If there are still places left vacant in the nominated teams, an open selection contest to test the respective sports skills of individual athletes may be held by a district to select suitable athletes to fill up the vacancies. Such open selection contest will be open to players of the other participating teams in the district selection or any person who meets the eligibility requirements for the HKG.

(e) Sports Competitions for Persons with Disabilities

To promote participation in sports activities from persons with disabilities, the 9th HKG will continue to work with the Sports Association for the Physically Disabled of Hong Kong, China in organising competitive events such as Boccia and wheelchair 3-on-3 basketball instead of traditional 5-on-5 basketball. Besides, the Hong Kong, China Sports Association for Persons with Intellectual Disability will organise swimming and table tennis competitions for persons with intellectual disability. Athletes selection for sports competitions for persons with disabilities will be held by the relevant national sports associations. To spread the message of disability inclusion, the finals of 3-on-3 basketball, swimming and table tennis events will be held alongside the respective HKG events, with prizes being awarded to the champion, first runner-up and second runner-up of each event.

Community Participation Programmes

- 8. In addition to holding sports competitions and related activities, the 9th HKG will continue to organise various community participation programmes and launch new initiatives/arrangements in 2023 and 2024 to seek more active public participation. The timetable for the 9th HKG's community participation programmes is at **Annex II**.
 - The Launching Event of the 9th HKG was held at Kowloon Park Sports Centre on 23 June 2023. In addition to announcing the general arrangements for the 9th HKG's programmes and appointing 10 Sports Ambassadors, the event featured a sharing session by the newly-appointed Sports Ambassadors, appealing for active public participation in district athlete selections.
 - The Star-studded Classroom Elite Athletes' Demonstration and Exchange Programmes were organised from September to November 2023, covering such sports items as table tennis, futsal, athletics, 3-on-3 basketball, volleyball, badminton, tennis and swimming. Experienced coaches and local elite athletes shared their experience, demonstrated sports skills, as well as took part in exchange and playin sessions for the participants. Moreover, the Sports Legacy Exercise to Get Super Fit, where fitness tests were conducted to explore participants' potential in sports, and the Sports Seminar, with the theme of the preventive measures against 3-on-3 basketball and futsal injuries, were both organised in September 2023, attracting an attendance of 1 095 in total.
 - iii) The Demonstration Event of Women's Futsal, originally scheduled for the 8th HKG, will take place this year.
 - iv) The 18 Districts' Pledge cum Cheering Team Competition is scheduled at Sun Yat Sen Memorial Park Sports Centre on 25 February 2024 (Sunday). In addition to the 18 Districts' Pledging Ceremony, this event will also feature voting and guessing activities, as well as the 18 Districts' Cheering Team Competition. Each district will send one cheering team for the competition. The details and arrangements are broadly in line with last year's approach, where the "Best Performance Awards" (comprising the Champion, the 1st Runner-up and the 2nd Runner-up), the "Best Local Characteristics Awards" (comprising the Champion, the 1st Runner-up),

as well as the "Highest Popularity Award" will be given.

- The Dynamic Moments Photo Contest will be organised, with the v) proposed subject themes including the 18 Districts' Pledging cum Cheering Team Competition, Vitality Run, Inter-district Competitions of the 8 Sports Events, Demonstration Competitions (such as breaking, skateboarding and sports climbing), Boccia Competition, Swimming Competition for Persons with Intellectual Disabilities, Table Tennis Competition for Persons with Intellectual Disabilities, Wheelchair 3on-3 Basketball Challenge, and Opening Ceremony and Closing cum Same as last year, this Prize Presentation Ceremony of the HKG. year's contest will be run in the Open and Student divisions, under each of which there will be a Champion, one 1st Runner-up, one 2nd Runner-up and 10 outstanding prize winners. Entries can be submitted online.
- vi) The Vitality Run is scheduled along the Shing Mun River in Sha Tin on 3 March 2024 (Sunday). Given commencement of the improvement works at Sha Tin Sports Ground (the Sports Ground), the venue for the past events, in the first half of 2024, it was proposed by Hong Kong, China Association of Athletics Affiliates that the original route of the 7th event be adopted following site inspection and discussion, except that the finish line will be changed from the Sports Ground to a location next to the Yuen Wo Road Bus Stop. As in the past, the road closure will last from 5:00 am to 10:30 am. The intended starting times will be 30 minutes earlier than last year, i.e. the 10 km and 3 km Runs will start at 8:00 am and 8:30 am respectively. The route of Vitality Run is at Annex III.
- vii) Activities and games under the Fun for All@ Hong Kong Games will be held on the days of final rounds of various competitions for spectators to enjoy the fun of sports and enhance their understanding in a wider range of sports.
- viii) The Opening Ceremony and Closing cum Prize Presentation Ceremony of the HKG are scheduled at Hong Kong Coliseum on 21 April 2024 (Sunday) and at Kowloon Park Sports Centre on 9 June (Sunday) respectively.

ix) New Initiatives/Arrangements

- Sport climbing, breaking and skateboarding, the popular urban sports among youths, will be introduced as demonstration competitions to this year's events, with a view to encouraging young people to showcase both their creativity and sports skills.
- Urban sports like breaking, sports climbing and skateboarding were newly included in the Star-studded Classroom and Elite Athletes' Exchange Programmes held in September 2023, drawing an attendance of about 150.
- To foster a sporting culture at schools, primary and secondary schools across Hong Kong are, with support from the Schools Sports Federation of Hong Kong, China, invited to organise the "Hong Kong Games Run and Exercise Together" in their athletic meets or any other school activities as deemed fit, where teachers, students and parents will take part in running activities during the playing of the HKG's theme song, or alternatively do fitness exercises together by following the demonstration videos of "Hong Kong Games Fitness Exercise".

Publicity Activities

- 9. To give wide publicity, the Secretariat will continue to publicise and promote the HKG through various channels and platforms, including printed materials, promotional videos, online and social media, as well as public relations campaigns and advertisements, in collaboration with relevant partner organisations, to solicit greater public participation in the district open selection of athletes and the relevant community participation programmes. Besides, the slogan "Our City, Our Games" will continue to be used in the 9th HKG to further promote the event. The ten co-organising NSAs have nominated athletes to be the ambassadors of the 9th HKG to assist in promoting the relevant sports competitions. The list of the sports ambassadors is at **Annex IV**.
- 10. Upon discussion on publicity matters with Radio Television Hong Kong (RTHK), it was decided that the finals of 7 sports events, namely futsal, table-tennis, badminton, basketball, wheelchair basketball competition, table-tennis invitational and women's futsal, would be broadcast live on RTHK TV, while the finals of 16 sports events, including 8 sports events, 4 sports events for persons with disabilities and 4 demonstrations of urban sports events, would be streamed live on social media platforms

- of RTHK. Besides, 17 videos featuring athletes' preparations, highlights of the finals, a series of community participation programmes and demonstrations of urban sports will be produced. On another front, the Secretariat will launch more promotional activities for the HKG at district level, such as setting up HKG zones/focal stations at sports centres, putting up major decorations at competition venues, as well as inviting elite athletes to attend the finals of sports competitions to show their support for the participating athletes.
- 11. The publicity campaign on district athlete selection commenced on 23 June, including the broadcast of new 30-second TV Announcements in the Public Interest (APIs) on promoting the HKG at local television stations, on the websites and YouTube channels of the Information Services Department, in MTR train compartments and on monitors in the lifts of the Government Headquarters, as well as 30-second radio APIs on RTHK. The 90-second full version of the 9th HKG promotional video was also broadcast on or uploaded onto the 9th HKG's dedicated website and YouTube channel, the youth website on youth.gov.hk, the LCSD Plusss Facebook and Instagram pages, the LCSD Edutainment Channel, the website, Facebook and Instagram pages of "Sportsoho", the televisions at District Offices, Community Halls, public housing estates, community centres and venues of the LCSD.
- 12. Other initiatives include engaging elite athletes and sports ambassadors in production of the HKG promotional videos, issuing press releases, placing newspaper advertisements, displaying publicity posters and banners at conspicuous locations across the 18 districts across Hong Kong, as well as giving wide publicity to the HKG through social networking platforms. Details of the publicity plan for the 9th HKG are at Annex V. The HKG mascot "Cheering Larry" will also be featured in community participation programmes and inter-district competitions to cheer on athletes, putting in a great effort to encourage active public participation in the HKG.

Sponsorship Arrangements

- 13. As in the 8th HKG, the Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust (the Jockey Club) also sponsor \$8.24 million in cash for specified events of the 9th HKG and is the principal contributor of the HKG and the title sponsor of Vitality Run, 3-on-3 basketball, futsal and swimming competitions. The Jockey Club's logo will be printed on a prominent position of the long-sleeve jacket and short-sleeve polo T-shirt of sports uniform, as well as sports shirt for Vitality Run.
- 14. 847 sponsorship invitation letters were sent by the Secretariat on 11 September 2023 according to the invitation list of sponsors endorsed by the OC. As at 3 October,

replies from 5 organisations were received. There were 3 new sponsors of the 9th HKG, among which China Taiping Insurance (HK) Company Limited provided the highest sponsorship of \$0.6 million, thereby securing a title sponsor for one of the events. Details of sponsorship are at **Annex VI**.

Way Forward

15. The OC and SC will continue discussing the preparatory work for the 9th HKG, with the implementation details subject to finalisation. Progress will be reported to the CSC in due course.

Presentation

16. Members are invited to note the progress on the work of the 9th HKGOC.
