Points to Note	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A person-in-charge aged 18 or above or a teacher should be designated to oversee the activities. 2. Participants are being able to swim with clothes for 50 metres when participating in dragon boat activities; Applicants of the level 1 Dragon Boat Helm Certificate training course is required to pass the swimming test organised by the NSA. 3. Schools can arrange their own training schedules. 4. The school shall arrange for its own transportation to and from the venue. 5. Training courses of Elementary, Intermediate and Advanced Dragon Boat Training Certificate are a series of progressive courses. Participants must pass the assessment at the elementary level before proceeding to the next higher level. 6. Only holders of Intermediate Certificate of Dragon Boat or above are eligible to take part in the Level 1 Dragon Boat Helm Certificate training course. 7. Dragon Boat is available under the Sport Captain Programme. Please refer to the respective prospectus for details. (P.187). 8. Upon completion of dragon boat training course under the Outreach Coaching Programme or Joint Schools Sports Training Programme, an assessment will be conducted by the coach according to various levels of badges standards of dragon boat. Participants who meet the required standard may obtain the badges and certificates according to their achieved levels from the NSA at their own cost. For details, please visit https://www.lcsd.gov.hk/en/ssp/badges.html. 9. Participants may purchase certificates or with dragon boat logbook from the NSA. (Indoor, Elementary, Intermediate and Advanced Dragon Boat Training Certificate cost \$50 respectively; Level 1 Dragon Boat Helm Certificate cost \$100; Logbook for dragon boat training courses cost \$50.) 10. A participant who takes part in the Elementary, Intermediate and Advanced Dragon Boat Training Certificate or Level 1 Dragon Boat Helm Certificate must be aged 12 or above and aged 15 or above respectively as at the event date. If any participant whose age is found under the specified age range, the LCSD will disqualify his/her participation and the enrolment fee will not be refunded. 11. If the NSA/LCSD fails to arrange the activity, the fees paid will be refunded. 	
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
