Target Participants	Primary school and secondary school students
Outline	<p>The Badminton World Federation has actively promoted AirBadminton, an emerging badminton discipline, in recent years in anticipation that badminton may be played not only in indoor arenas but also in outdoor fields, including lawns, bare sandy ground and hard surface ground, thus encouraging public participation in the sport for fun.</p> <p>The sport equipment and proposed rules for AirBadminton may vary a bit to the indoor badminton ones, such as the use of special shuttlecocks and rackets of lower string tension (between 17.5 and 20 lbs recommended), game formats (singles, doubles, triples), court dimensions (for singles: courts of 5 metres by 16 metres; for doubles or triples: courts of 6 metres by 16 metres), as well as designation of the front court areas within 2 metres on both sides of nets as a “Dead Zone” where players are barred from stepping into it.</p> <p>Activity content: Introduction to the features and general rules of AirBadminton, demonstration as to how to set up makeshift AirBadminton courts, athletes demonstration and play-in sessions for students</p>
Venue	Flat surfaces of at least 8 metres by 18 metres for courts
